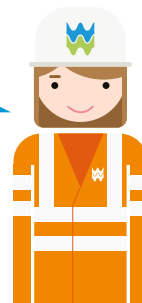

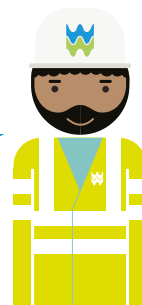
Tell me how much to put in using interesting measurements! e.g. A splash of duck poo, 4 teaspoons of sand
